

# OUTDOOR FABRIC POLYESTER/COTTON & POLYPROPYLENE

## Material & Care



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## MATERIAL

- 60% cotton + 40% polyester.
- or:
- 100% polypropylene.

## CARE

### We recommend:

- Always remove stains and dirt immediately to prevent soiling from penetrating too deeply into the fabric.
- Before cleaning with water, brush off loose dirt and dust particles.
- In most cases, dirt and stains can be removed with water and a mild soapy solution using a cloth or soft brush. Always rinse with clean water and leave to dry well in the shade.
- Clean complete cushions with non-removable fabric covers by hand as follows:  
Brush off coarse dirt. Pre-treat soiled areas with warm soapy water, a cloth or a soft brush. Then soak the covers in a bathtub with water at max. 30°C and detergent or soap. If the water is too hot, the shape of the cushion may suffer. The soaking time depends on the degree of soiling. Carefully knead the cushion at regular intervals and treat stubborn stains with a soft brush. If necessary, replace the water or top up with warm water. At the end of the cleaning process, rinse dissolved dirt particles and soap residues thoroughly out of the cushions with clear water to avoid stains.
- After cleaning or washing, it is important to allow the cushions to air dry thoroughly in the shade. Lay the cushions flat on a smooth surface and squeeze them out until almost no water escapes. Then gently pull the cushion back into its original shape. To dry thoroughly, either hang it up outside or lay it flat on a laundry rack. If no more liquid escapes when the cushion is squeezed and the surface is no longer damp, the drying process is usually complete.
- Attention: Never wash complete cushions in the washing machine and never tumble dry them, as this can cause the foam/fleece filling of the cushions to shift or clump together.

## STORAGE

- If you want to enjoy your cushions for a long time, it is advisable not to expose them to unnecessary soiling and to store them with care, and not just in winter. Even in summer, rain, sun and dirt are the natural enemies of your upholstery.

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- We therefore recommend storing the cushions in a protected place when not in use.
  - Depending on the size and type of cushions, special cushion boxes are suitable for this purpose. The type of box depends largely on the chosen location.
  - Entire sets of furniture can be covered with appropriate protective covers. However, good ventilation to prevent waterlogging is essential. The cushions, if they remain under the protective cover, should be completely dry. See also our SIEGER protective covers.
  - Overwinter the cushions in a cleaned and dried condition and protect them from dirt in dry rooms. Avoid storage in a damp or warm and humid environment. Ensure that the cushions are well ventilated. This will prevent the formation of mould stains or mildew
