# **OUTDOOR RUGS**

## **Material & Care**



## **MATERIAL**

- 100% polypropylene.
- Outdoor rugs "Made in Europe".
- The material used fulfils all the requirements of the European REACH regulation.

## **PROPERTIES**

- Usable indoors and outdoors.
- Durable, robust and hardwearing.
- Tear-resistant and dimensionally stable.
- Weather-resistant, lightfast and UV-stabilised.
- Mould-resistant and antibacterial.
- Water-repellent and quick-drying.
- Tested for fire retardant and antistatic properties.

## **CARE**

#### We recommend:

- Even if your rug is very robust and durable, you should clean it regularly so that you can enjoy it for a long time.
- Remove surface soiling as quickly as possible before it burns into the fibres through UV light and summer heat.
- Vacuum off dust, dirt and deposits with a hoover or sweep them off with a conventional broom. Remove stubborn dirt or stains with a garden hose or high-pressure cleaner and light water pressure. Pre-treat stubborn stains with lukewarm mild soapy water and remove with a soft absorbent cloth. Then rinse off soap suds residues thoroughly with water.
- Never use cleaners containing chlorine, acids or solvents or abrasive or scouring agents for cleaning.
- Always allow the rug to dry thoroughly after damp cleaning.

#### Notes:

- Outdoor rugs are developed for outdoor use and are therefore very weather-resistant and easy to care for. However, constant moisture and humidity between the fibres will affect even the most uncomplicated rug material in the course of time. Rainwater should therefore always drain away. Allow the rug to dry thoroughly so that the fabric does not become brittle in the long term and no mould stains form on the rug.
- Alternating strong sunlight and rain can cause the rug to fade slightly after a while.

# **STORAGE**

- During the winter and rainy months, roll up the rug and store it in a sheltered, dry place. Severe frost, snow and constant moisture could damage the fibres.
- We recommend cleaning the outdoor rug thoroughly and allowing it to dry well before storing it.
